Also visitors can perform a currency exchange based on the latest information and also display a customized graph of historical exchange rates for 164 countries. Visitors shouldn't overlook the "Weekly Indicators" area, which includes information on commodity prices, Asian GDP growth forecasts, budget balances, and producer prices.

Although the site is oriented toward financial management, the links cover all facets of business from accounting and business ethics through world marketing. The depth of the pages is not immediately apparent; selecting a listing provides a pathway to an even more extensive array of links to explore. Students, faculty, researchers, and the general public will find this portal a comprehensive, easy-to-use, and valuable source of reliable links, and a resource worth bookmarking for daily use.
